Year 5 Open Evening – Thursday 4th July

Our Open Evening is being held on Thursday, 4th July from 5.00pm to 8.00pm. Pupils in Year 5 and their parents will have the opportunity to visit SHSG and see our wonderful school in action with tours, lesson demonstrations, performances and talks from Mr Carey and senior leaders. Year 7s and Year 10 and 12 student leaders will also be presenting. Each year on Open Evening we have hundreds of our student ambassadors leading prospective families on tours around the school and helping in departments. 




Operation Theatre Live – A write up from the Science Captains

On Thursday, 6th June, the Year 12 Biology students had the chance to participate in a live dissection hosted by 'Operation Theatre Live'. This immersive experience involved collaborating with classmates to explore the anatomy of a pig, allowing us to examine closely its internal structures. Working together, we gained a comprehensive understanding of the pig's heart, lungs, eyes, head, and digestive system. Throughout the day, the instructor provided detailed demonstrations of the dissection process and shared fascinating insights into medicine and human anatomy, enriching our learning experience. Following the instructions, we organised ourselves into groups to conduct the dissection, which fostered initiative and heightened our scientific curiosity. This experience not only deepened our grasp of the A-Level Biology curriculum, but also served as valuable preparation for those interested in pursuing Medicine or other biological studies after school. We extend our gratitude to Operation Theatre Live and the Biology Department for this invaluable experience!







Create Week

During the Creative and Performing Arts Faculty *Create Week* before half term, students in Year 12 and Year 8 worked collaboratively on a Dutch Delftware inspired project. First, the Year 8 students used cobalt oxide to work on a tile each to recreate a mural drawn by a Year 12 student, who was inspired by boats in Leigh-on-Sea. Each student also received an individual tile to create a delftware inspired self-portrait using the same cobalt oxide to give that distinctive, recognisable finish. I think you will agree that the results are phenomenal!


