Southend Festival of Performing Arts: SHSG Choirs

Last week, our choirs performed at the Southend Festival of Performing Arts, formerly the Southend Music Festival. The forty-strong SHSG Choir sung popular arrangements of *City of Stars* and *My Favourite Things* conducted by Sixth Former and incoming Head Student, Cerys, and were praised by the judges who awarded them the Claire Robert's prize for 'most moving performance'. It was great to see our students make friends with some of the competing choirs and it was noted that their conduct on the trip was outstanding. On the same morning, Chamber Choir competed against old rivals St Bernard's, performing evocative choral works by *Ola Gjeilo* and Tori Amosthey were awarded the Hobbs Challenge Shield. Finally, Novem Consort, performed on Saturday evening in the closing night of the Festival and went up against adult choir Gaudeamus. Novem won the Dulcian Madrigal Shield and were highly commended by the professional adjudicator Luise Horrocks, who remarked on their 'warm and lovely tone colour' and 'very accomplishing singing'. Another group who were present, Southend Vox, contacted the school this week to congratulate Novem: 'The Students are a real credit to SHSG, and as both our choirs are led by 'old girls' it's really lovely to see them flying the flag for music at Southend High, which is where we all cut our own musical teeth'. These choirs can all be heard performing this repertoire at the forthcoming Winter Concerts on Monday 9th (SHSG Choir) and Tuesday 10th December (Chamber Choir and Novem). Driving with Grace - Year 12

This Thursday all Year 12 students watched a documentary on the perils of dangerous driving, produced by the <u>Driving with Grace</u> campaign. Students from SHSG set up the Driving with Grace campaign in memory of Eleanor Grace McGrath, who sadly died due to the action of a young, careless driver. Eleanor was a much-loved student at SHSG, and her senseless death in 2009 shocked the school and wider community. It is a powerful and emotional documentary which serves to underline the importance of careful driving, as many of our Year 12 students approach getting their licence and are taking lifts from newly passed drivers. Natwest Enterprise - Year 12 & Year 13

This Friday, we invited NatWest Thrive to speak to Sixth Formers. The organisation is championing entrepreneurial education and aims to focus on an entrepreneurial mindset and bridge the gap between education and post-18 entrepreneurial opportunities in the workplace. Students attended a one-hour workshop on developing their entrepreneurial mindset in preparation for the future world of work.





Oxbridge Prep Club - Year 10 & Year 11

We were delighted to welcome over 60 Year 10 and 11 students to the inaugural meeting of the Key Stage 4 Oxbridge Pathway group on Tuesday. It was fantastic to see how keen and ambitious our KS4 cohort is, it was standing room only in our session.

We have been working closely with Emmanuel College Cambridge and Hertford College Oxford who as part of the <u>Next Steps Essex</u>. scheme are keen to work with our students. They have provided us with a number of exciting opportunities (see links below) that our students can apply for.

Our next meeting will be on Thursday 9th January in the Media Studio. All students in KS4 are welcome to attend. In January's meeting we welcome those students who would like some help with applying for these opportunities.

In addition, the Cambridge outreach team have confirmed that they will visit SHSG and speak to all year groups about university life and applications in March 2025.

Mathematical Minds Shine

SHSG students recently showcased their mathematical prowess at the Essex Schools Mathematics Team Challenge, held at SHSB. Our two talented teams—led by Maya, Tegan, Helian, Bluebell, Anna, Darcey, Tom and Verity—competed against 25 teams from 21 schools across the region.

The evening was a thrilling test of mathematical skill, featuring three dynamic rounds that challenged teamwork and problem-solving:

- A high-pressure group round requiring collaborative strategy
- A silent cross number puzzle where each team split into two separate pairs: one pair solving only across clues, the other pair solving only down clues, without any verbal communication between the pairs
- A complex "shuttle" round where pairs exchanged written solutions, with each pair's answer becoming part of the next pair's problem-solving challenge

We're incredibly proud to announce that our teams secured impressive 8th and 19th place finishes—a remarkable achievement in such a competitive field!

Beyond the rankings, our students demonstrated exceptional mathematical thinking, strategic collaboration, and school spirit. They returned energized and inspired, embodying the problem-solving excellence we value at SHSG.

Congratulations to all our participating mathematicians—you've made us proud!



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
