Year 7 Parent's Evening Thursday 23rd January

I want to remind parents that the Year 7 Parents' Evening takes place online **on Thursday, 23rd January**. In such instances, staff will be inviting the parents of the students that they most want to see before the appointments are made available for general booking. As a result, some parents may receive meeting notifications in advance of being able to book their appointments. Cursed Pens (Finally) Presented



Parent support for social media

Some of our students may have received their first mobile phone for Christmas or an upgraded phone. As governments worldwide review their guidance on mobile phone use by young people, I thought that it would be helpful for you to summarise our school policy on mobile phones. Our policy is that students (Years 7-11) may bring their phones into school, but they must be turned off and kept out of sight at all times. The phone must not be used to send messages, view apps or contact parents during the school day. Should a student need to contact a parent during the school day, they can do this by going to reception and speaking to the reception staff. PE Changing Rooms reminder

Year 11 and 13 students sit their PPE examinations in the Sports Hall. This means students cannot access the changing rooms, the PE classroom, the sports hall and the fitness suite.

When students have a PE lesson or an extracurricular club, they must come to school in their PE kit and remain in it all day. At the start of their lesson (or club), students should go to the gym, where they will be registered and taken to their learning area. Students will be outside in all weathers, so please wear the appropriate school PE kit. The extracurricular timetable will also change, and students will be notified through their respective MS Teams pages. Regular changing room access will resume on Monday, January 20th. Students who are found to be wearing PE kit on days when they do not have a PE lesson or a club will receive a behaviour point.
